Professor Colin Jones joined the History Department at Queen Mary in September 2006, having spent the previous ten years at the University of Warwick. His most recent books have included: *The Great Nation; France 1715-99* and *Madame de Pompadour: images on a mistress*, both 2002. Most recently his book *Paris; Biography of a City* (2004) won the Enid Macleod Prize of the Franco-British Society. His current research interests are on the history of the smile, focussing on eighteenth-century Paris.
