## The Black Lives Matter Student Prize



The School of Law want to recognise and encourage the work that our students are doing as part of the struggle against racism, as well as their desire to imagine, enact and embody a more just and equal world. **The Black Lives Matter Student Prize** is an annual award that recognises the outstanding contributions of our undergraduate (UG) law students in advancing the cause of anti-racism within and/or outside the university, whether domestically or internationally.

## Criteria

This prize is open to all current UG students in the School of Law at QMUL who have demonstrated a commitment to anti-racist initiatives, writings or other activity within and/or outside the university.

## Selection process

Students may nominate themselves, or be nominated by another student, or a member of academic or professional services staff. Only individual students may be nominated.

Nominators must submit a 300-word statement of evidence as to how the student has demonstrated a commitment to anti-racist activities or initiatives. Evidence may include, but is not limited to, events they have organised, blogs or other written work they have produced, art-work they have created etc.

Applications will be considered by the Department of Law's Anti-Racist Working Group and a member of the UK Black Lives Matter steering committee.

Two students will be selected for the prize. Each winner will receive a prize of £300. Information about the prize will also be added to the student's transcript.
