Key facts about Queen Mary

- A budget of £682,000 has been allocated for upgrading the library
- Over the last 4 years, £46m has been spent on the Student Village
- £5.3m has been spent on the Students' Union Drapers Bar and Fitness Centre
- £5.7m has been invested in teaching facilities.
- Scholarships, studentships, bursaries and prizes amounted to £17m in 2008
- Research Income increased from £51.4m in 2006-07 to £60.7m in 2008

Science and Engineering

- Current active research grant value from all sources (Research Councils, Charities, Government organisations and industry) is in excess of £43 million
- Current peer-reviewed research council funded grants alone are in excess of £45 million which are distributed over more than 120 separate grants across the school

Humanities and Social Sciences

- More than £10 million in major research grants have been awarded by such agencies as the Arts and Humanities Research Council, The Economic and Social Research Council, the Leverhulme Trust, the British Academy, the British Council, and the National Lottery since January 2001

Medicine and Dentistry

- The School has over 250 research associates or fellows and has an annual budget of approximately £30 million
- The School has around 800 registered postgraduate students: 400 MPhil/PhD students, 100 MDRes students and 300 postgraduate taught course students
