



The Laboratory of Cultural Industries, Society and Environment is a gathering with public lectures, a transdisciplinary workshop and a research programme that seeks to broaden the conversation, find common ground and generate tools and methodologies for action at the intersection of culture and the environmental crisis.

The Laboratory emerges from MUTUA, a collaborative space for research and intervention at the crossroads of culture and the environmental crisis, generated by Queen Mary University of London (QMUL) and the Universidad Nacional de Tres de Febrero (UNTREF) together with various sectoral and territorial alliances.



The environmental crisis intersects with other social, economic and territorial issues and requires a transdisciplinary approach situated in the local context. In response, we propose a collaborative working space that brings together different perspectives and experiences from the cultural industries with knowledge from social and environmental studies.

The laboratory will consist of three elements:

> A series of conferences and public conversations.

- A space of collaboration in which key players and experts from the cultural industries, the arts, and social and environmental studies will meet to work towards shared visions, define a common work agenda, and think of practical and specific proposals.
- A research project to reflect on and move forward the ideas and conversations that emerge from the laboratory.



The laboratory will take place on Friday 9 and Saturday 10 June 2023, at the Museo de la Inmigración (MUNTREF) and the UNTREF Rector's Office (Buenos Aires, Argentina).
