## **Queen Mary Intellectual Property Research Institute**

The generosity of Dr Herchel Smith's enabled Queen Mary College (as it was then known) to be the first University in England to establish a dedicated intellectual property law research unit with an endowed Chair in Intellectual Property Law. The first Herchel Smith Chair was taken up in 1981 by James C. Lahore. This was followed by the creation of the first UK-based academic archive library to house a specialist intellectual property collection, with an ambition to acquire 'every text in English on intellectual property law'. Along with the Chartered Institute of Patent Agents (CIPA), Dr Herchel Smith was instrumental in the creation of the current Intellectual Property Archive at QMUL.

The current QMIPRI is part of the Centre for Commercial Law Studies at Queen Mary University of London and is based at the postgraduate law centre in Lincoln's Inn Fields, London. It has, since its inception in 1981, become an internationally renowned research institution in intellectual property law and related areas of commercial law fostering independent research and training postgraduate and doctoral students.
