The row in which it stood had been partially obliterated by the Blitz; the clearance of the terrace during the 1990s was a small moment in the huge phenomenon of gentrification that has accelerated through London's East End during the past three decades.  The work was hailed as one of the greatest public sculptures by an English artist in the 20 <sup>th</sup> C yet it was demolished in 1994. House attracted tens of thousands of visitors and generated impassioned debate, in the local streets, the national press and in the House of Commons The Artangel website has an excellent case study including a video of the meaning, history and impact of the artwork.
