Some of the alarms were caused accidentally by contractors working on site. Management would report back with the underlying data.	Director of Health and Safety	There were two large projects going on during this period and in the early stages of these projects there were a large number of contactors working in buildings at any one time with limited awareness of the fire alarm systems. These operatives, by the nature of their work, generated dust which triggered the alarms in that area. Awareness training and more effective contractor management was put in place and the activation issues were resolved as a result.
