To qualify, candidates must have a BA Honours degree (2.i or above) in modern and/or contemporary British history or a related subject. They must have an interest in and knowledge of British Government. They must also be able to demonstrate effective communication and interpersonal skills.

Candidates should apply for a place on the MA in Modern and Contemporary British History and for the Mile End Group Assistantship simultaneously (see how to apply for the <u>MA</u>) In addition to the normal application materials (outlined on our webpage under 'Application Checklist'), candidates are required to submit a 300-word statement outlining their suitability for the post.

The MA in Modern and Contemporary British History

Requirements of the MEG Assistant Post

MEGAs will carry out their MEG duties while also studying full time on the School of History's <u>MA in Modern and Contemporary British History</u>. Their fees will be paid and they will receive a studentship of £4,000. There are two conditions: (i) that they write their MA dissertation on a Whitehall or Westminster related history topic, broadly-defined; and (ii) that they fulfil their specific duties for MEG under the management of the Director, <u>Dr Jon Davis</u>. All MEGAs are expected to be on duty for the various MEG events, many of which will be held in the evenings, as well as three days per week based in the Mile End Group Office. At these events, MEGAs will in effect run them, ensuring their smooth delivery.

The role of each MEGA will include:

- liaising with the various elements of QM which handle media relations; invite specific VIPs to events; and assist in the delivery of the MEG newsletter.
- liaising with the various elements of QM which handle events; book venues and hospitality; and hold overall responsibility for the MEG events.
- liaising with the various elements of QM which deal with computer services; film MEG events and VIPs on 'The New Labour in Government' MA module; and assist in the delivery of an up-to-date MEG website.

Application Requirements and Procedure
