## Outgoing Student Exchange Programme: Estimated Costs of Living

As part of the application process, you will need to ensure that you have access to sufficient finances to support yourself during the period of your exchange programme. Many of our partner/host institutions in most destination countries will require you to demonstrate evidence of sufficient finances during the application process to them as a nominated student, if you are successful in being made a Conditional offer of exchange by Queen Mary. The host institution will specify the exact amount that you will need to survive as a full-time student at their institution. You will be asked to provide evidence to prove that you have this funding, especially yet but not limited to the visa application process. The evidence required will depend on how you will be funding your exchange programme:

- Students who support themselves will need to provide bank statements or bank letters to confirm they have sufficient savings.
- Students who will be supported by family or friends will need to provide bank statements/letters from their guarantors.
- Students who will be using student loans need to provide letters from the relevant authority confirming the amount of funding available.

Please note you cannot use evidence of future potential earnings for this purpose. Whatever the source, the funds should be available at the time of completing the host university's paperwork.

## Cost of living by country (rates and values current as of October 2023)

IMPORTANT: The cost of living and inflation will continue to increase over the course of the coming 12 months and throughout the next mobility year in 2024/25 - you must factor this into your decision-making. Therefore, the amounts below will quickly become outdated; we advise you to add $10 \%$ (at the very least) on top of the below figures to factor these anticipated increases into your decision-making and budgeting. Pay special attention to the local currency figures and recalculate conversions into UK Sterling to reach a more accurate estimation throughout the coming months.

The below figures are based on partner (host institution) and/or student feedback for costs during the 2022/23 academic year, calculated based on information from host institutions and exchange rates current as of October 2023. Therefore, they are approximate estimations for the next academic year and will fluctuate over the course of the coming 12 months. These will not be the exact amount requested by your host institution. The amounts are quoted as a variable range with approximate minimum/maximum amounts and have been calculated based on an average five-month semester / 10-month full academic year. They should be used as a guide only, yet the minimum amount will not be lower than what is quoted, and the actual cost specified by your host institution may be higher.
The amounts relate to required expenditure only (accommodation, utilities, food, public transportation, any required health insurance, books, etc). The amounts do not include travel to/from the host country, leisure activities, eating/going out, tourism, additional travel etc. Those costs will be on top of what is quoted below, as lifestyle choices and budgeting for these vary drastically between students.
