# Winner of Attorney General Student Pro Bono Awards Best Team of Students - SPITE

The Attorney General Student Pro Bono Awards took place on 28th April at the House of Commons. The LAC was shortlisted for three awards: **Best Contribution** by a Law School, **Best New Project** and Best Team of Students. We were thrilled that our SPITE (sharing and publishing intimate images to embarrass #revengeporn) team of students won the above award for all their hard work.

"Students are required to work beyond their expected capacity in order to cope with the high volume of clients, whilst processing and assimilating a new area of law with very little written, to explain or assist them."

The project advises people who have had private sexual images of themselves shared, as well as campaigning about the law and surrounding issues. The project has engaged 25 students since February 2015. Students have undertaken as many as 10 clients each, taking up to 20 hours per client.

9 students attended secondary schools, providing workshops and have developed ways to educate a younger audience, such as producing artificial Facebook accounts to show how quickly images spread, as well as demonstrations of mobile phone privacy settings.

Students also conduct client appointments with victims where, at times, clients share extremely sensitive information.

Since starting the project, 400 school students have been educated and a further 40 law practitioners have attended CPD seminars on the sharing of intimate images.

# The Breakfast Club

Coffee, croissants and chat

This year, the LAC started what has become known as the Breakfast Club. At 8.30 a.m. every Wednesday and Friday, LAC students who have undertaken their client interview the previous night, join the LAC Team for an indepth discussion about the areas of law the client presented with, any ethical issues raised, difficulties in dealing with clients, and general exploration of their cases. The first term Clubs required compulsory attendance but despite the

second term being optional, over 80% of Student Advisers dragged themselves from their warm beds and joined LAC staff for the early morning (sometimes sleepy) discussions.

"It was a great, the chance to talk to my peers about the issues I was dealing with, and the feedback I received, made more complicated issues seem easier to synthesise and resulted in more tailored research into particular legal issues, as well as bringing my attention to other issues that I may have missed during the interview."
