Professor David M Smith

Professor David M Smith is Emeritus Professor of Geography at OMUL, He's been



a Fellow of the British Academy since 2009.

David was appointed Professor of Geography at Queen Mary College (as QMUL was then known) in 1973 where he remained until he retired. During his time at Queen Mary, he wrote a number of books on geographical aspects of inequality, social justice and morality, with a blend of theory and case studies from the United States, Eastern Europe, South Africa and Israel.

The School of Geography has been honouring David's work with an annual lecture since 2004 - the 13th David M Smith Annual Lecture this year will be given by former QMUL Geography student Tom Slater, a graduate of 1998, who is now Reader in Urban Geography at the University of Edinburgh.
