The programme includes modern masterworks by Olivier Messiaen, lannis Xenakis and George Crumb as well as works by leading younger British composers, some created especially for this singular event, which is devised and curated by Ossian Artistic Director **Neil Georgeson**, and composer **Darren Bloom**.



The Ossian Ensemble is a virtuoso new-music group with players drawn from the LSO, LPO and Academy of St Martin in the Fields; they have worked with many of today's leading UK composers including Thomas Adès, Jonathan Harvey and their honorary patron Sir Maxwell Davies, and have premiered hundreds of works by emerging composers. Recent performances include Pierrot Lunaire at the Linbury Studio, a highlightfeature in the Sounds New Festival, and representing the UK at the International Composers' Pyramid.
