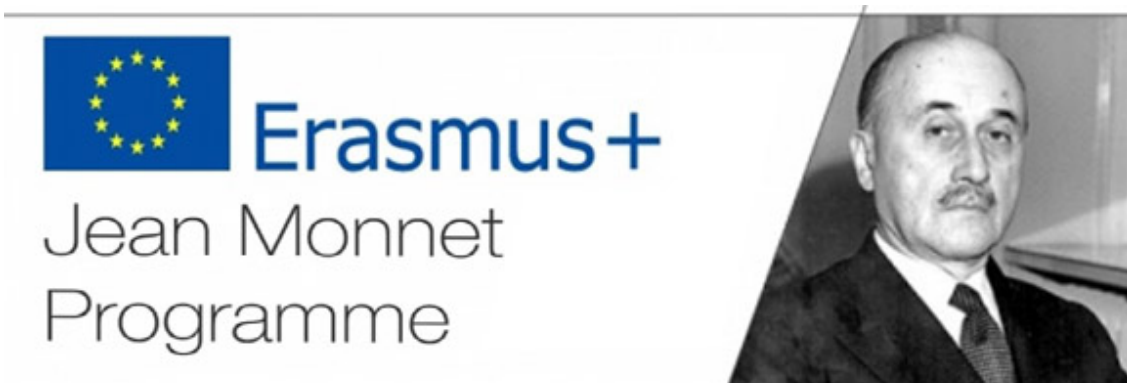
Dear Follower,

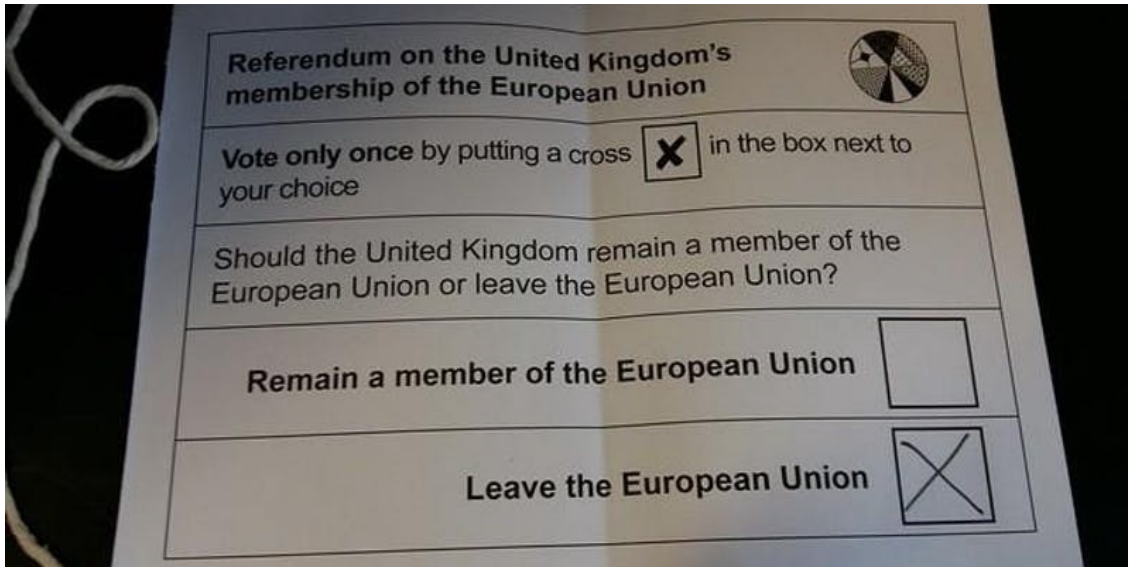
