## Dear friend

I fear I give you too much trouble by sending you my papers. But I cannot satisfy myself if, in matters of <u>controversy</u>, I do not submit my pieces to your better judgement.

On second thoughts, I am of opinion that it will be right to take the opportunity of Mr Levi's<sup>1</sup> Answer,<sup>2</sup> poor as it is, to address the Jews once more.<sup>3</sup> It will tend to keep up their attention, and may bring forth something of more value. But, if you have leisure, peruse what I send, and give me your opinion.

I have talked with Mr Hawkes<sup>4</sup> about the case of <u>Mr Dinwiddie</u>,<sup>5</sup> and we are clear that he cannot be ordained <u>here</u>. In my opinion, it had best be done in your own chapel, and if you think it of any consequence, I would attend, and take any part that should be thought proper. To ordain an <u>unitarian</u> minister, <u>as such</u>, may be of consequence, and have some effect. Your meeting is the proper place, as the head quarters of unitarianism, the great <u>mother church</u>, and which I hope will have many daughters.

I am very glad to hear what you say of the report concerning  $\underline{D^r Price}^6$  to which, tho' positively related, I was very unwilling to give credit.<sup>7</sup>

You will see that I have not quite concluded my last letter, but I have nothing very material to add. Please to return the MS as soon as you conveniently can.

Next sunday is our charity sermon to be preached by Mr Yates of Liverpool.<sup>8</sup> I am Dear friend yours & M<sup>rs</sup> Lindsey's most affectionately J Priestley
